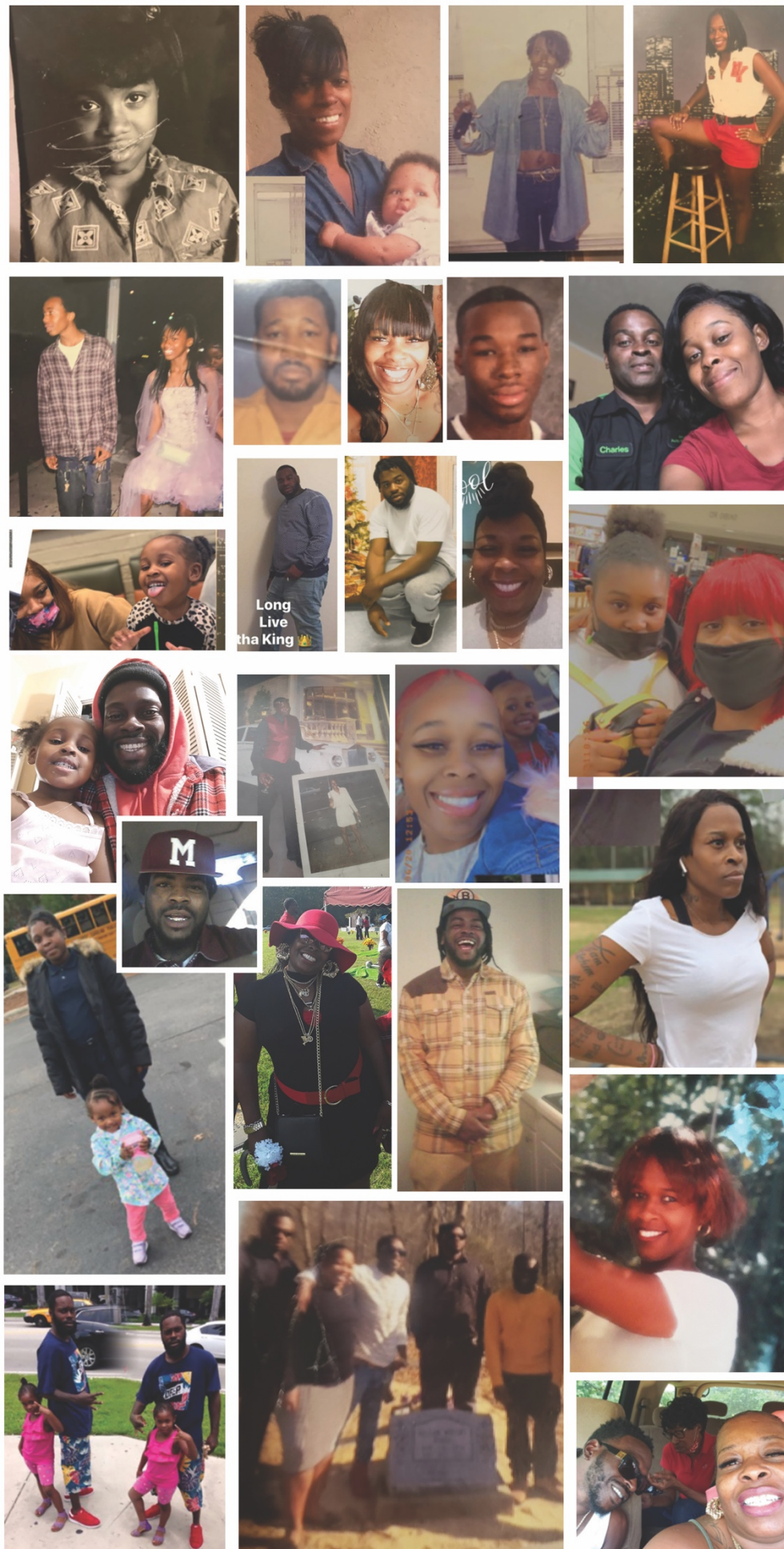
The Obituary
