

# Obituary

A Prayer Warrior, Kind-Hearted, Gentle, Friend, Compassionate, Vibrant, Faithful Servant, and a Wonderful Mother to ALL are just a few of the attributes that merely begin to scratch the surface of Mrs. Anne Rose Henry's journey—called Life.

Anne Rose, affectionaly known as Sr. Vilmar, M<sup>me</sup> Vilmar, but better known as "Yaway". Yaway was born on a beautiful day on June 15, 1940, to Mr. Manasse Phanor and Cenezia Senextant-Phanor (both deceased by her 10th birthday) — in the city of Borgne, Haiti.

When she escaped Haiti, for the American Dream, she traveled along with others on a small ship for approximately nine days into the Bahamas, then finally into the United States. She also became a U.S. Citizen, an accomplishment that made her proud. She stood by the mantra- each one teach one. Yaway's plan of action was to work, save money, and file for others to come into the States. Despite the fear of being caught, falling ill, or dying on the ship, she was favored and focused on escaping and arriving to what she saw as freedom or the earthly promise land.

The story about the nickname, Yaway goes as follows: on Thursdays, this ardent follower of Christ refused to wait or count on a ride for church -she walked, yes walked from NE 62nd street (near Biscayne Blvd) to NW 46th Street and North Miami Avenue (approximately a 20 block trek) to attend Missionaire (the Church Missionary Praying Group). She was dressed all in white with her hair tied, similar to an organization who resided on 62nd street in Miami. The Nation of Yahweh is a predominantly African American branched off the Black Hebrew Israelite religious movement. Completely different vision and mission. Her two children (Beatrice and Jonathan) and two nieces, Lenie and Fanie, started calling her Yaway, which she never responded to. Additionally, she gave ample notice of a nearby whipping if we did not leave her alone.

After a while, more neighboring kids and families started calling her "Yaway" (every Thursdays), and just like that, the name stuck. Even the grandnieces and grandnephews called her "Auntie-Yaway". Refusing to stay in just one area code the nickname extended from Canada to Haiti.

Yaway was a woman of great faith that was after God's own heart. Her staunch faith in Christ made her believe no matter how hopeless a situation seemed or the severity of the storms, God's plan was always perfect! She had a way of impacting the lives she encountered with her affectionate smile, words of encouragement, laughter, and genuine friendship. As a firm believer, she believed for every situation, there was a solution. Spiritually speaking, Yaway set her gaze on the beauty and the prosperity of life rather than the trials and tribulations that seek to consume us.

Although Yaway came from simple beginnings, she nurtured a passion for God's people through various ministries. Evangelistic and intercessory prayers at individuals' homes or in the streets. Hard-worker, optimistic, and educated this Woman of God – was also a Mother of three. For the last 79 ½ years, she has raised three remarkable, productive, determined, and respectable children: Vilianne (deceased 1/13/2019), Beatrice, and Jonathan. She was a devoted wife to her husband, Vilmar Henry (deceased 7/15/2003).

Yaway found no greater joy than spending time with her family and vicariously living the wonders of life through her children, and also numerous nieces and nephews. Yaway desired a multigenerational impact of God in the lives of her family. One of her missions was to equip them with the necessities to be God-fearing children, willing vessels for the Lord, and greatly contributing and respectable citizens in their communities.

She loved to see people excel, particularly academically. She was always praying for individuals to not only do well but to surpass the impossibilities.

As the matriarch of the family, she saw first hand the work of God in her life and family. She was considered the matriarch of the family. A multi-faceted servant, the peacemaker, the mediator, the individual that brought people together through prayer; she was a confidant and a warring prayer partner.

Yaway loved wide and hard. When she migrated from Haiti, she was an active member of Hosanna Nazarene Church, which later became Haitian Baptist Church of the Living God (Miami-Dade County) and for the last eight years, an active member of Nazarene International Ministries (Broward County).

On earth, she was God's heart in loving action...now she's Heaven's most precious and latest edition.
