A beautiful life ended on August 20, 2022. Frances Sarah Rodgers Dawkins, 99, was the fifth child of eight born to Eddie and Viola Robinson Rodgers. Frances was born on January 17, 1923, in Rodgerstown, SC.

Frances attended The Rodgerstown School, where she completed eighth grade, as was common for the times, with the need for the children of farmers to remain poised for family duties.

She was baptized into her family church at an early age and remained a faithful member of Woodson Chapel Baptist Church until her health prevented her regular attendance. She was also awarded the distinction of "Mother of the Church," a title she proudly bore.

She was the widow of Phorzene Dawkins, Sr.
