Obituary



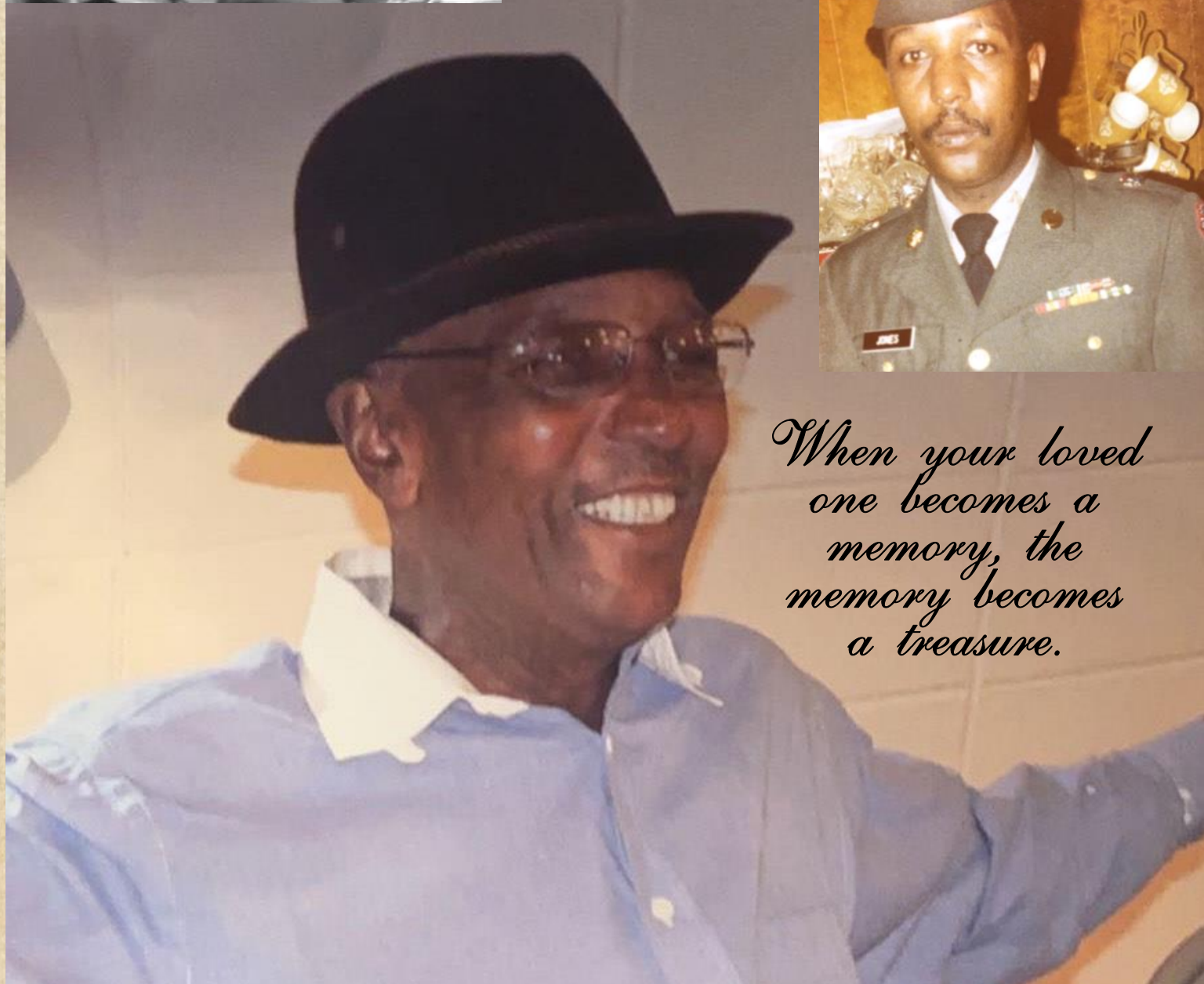
