## Obituary

Mother Lillie Ruth Tykes, affectionately known as Momma, Mommy, Ma, Baby Girl, Sunshine, Granny, Granny - Granny, and Auntie Lillie, was born on Sunday, September 29, 1935, in Philadelphia, Mississippi to parents Jessie and Necie Bell Kirkland.

She attended Hopewell Elementary and High School in Philadelphia, and moved to Chicago, Illinois in 1954 after she graduated from high school.

Lillie accepted the Lord at an early age and was a third generation member of the Church of God in

Christ in Philidelphia. The four sisters, Lillie, Ollie Mae, Jessie Lou, and Jessie Ruth, had no choice but to attend church on a regular basis with their mother. One fond memory was that they sat in chairs and had to tarry at the altar often. While tarrying Lillie was saved, sanctified, baptized and filled with the power of the Holy Ghost to the bone.

Mother Kirkland traveled to Chicago with Lillie to stay with Mother Johnson, affectionately known as Aunt Martha. Lillie wanted to go to a Church of God in Christ, and Aunt Martha knew just the person to call: Freddie Hobbs. He was currently a member of St. Lawrence Church of God in Christ, where Elder Hezzie Hudson was pastor. Lillie eventually lived with Pastor Hezzie and Mother Rebecca Hudson until she married.

Otis Sykes and Lillie met at the state youth night service. Mother Hudson asked Brother Sykes to give Ms. Kirkland a ride home. On Saturday, January 18, 1958, Lillie Ruth Kirkland was joined in holy matrimony to Otis Edward Sykes. Otis decided to join Lillie at the St. Lawrence Church of God in Christ. To this union four children were born: Edward Andre, Sylvia, Elaine, and Jennifer.

Lillie joined Saint Lawrence Church of God in Christ under the leadership of Pastor Hezzie Hudson, located at 4422 South Cottage Grove Avenue. The church later moved to 6959 South Vincennes, then to 7400 South St. Lawrence Avenue in Chicago.
