EMMA COUNCIL, the only child of the late Amie Ross and James William Jones, was born on July 19, 1921 in Morrisville, North Carolina. She entered into her eternal rest on Friday, August 13, 2021, at Bella Rose Nursing and Rehab Center in Garner, NC.

Emma joined White Oak Missionary Baptist Church in 1933 when she was 12 years old. She was an active member of the Gospel Choir, Pastors Aide, Usher, and the Missionary Circle. She received her strength from the Word of God. She started each day in prayer and reading her devotionals. A missionary from the heart is what Emma was. She loved checking on others by a call that often ended in laughter.

In 1947, she married the late Lee Council, Sr. and to this union, four children were born, Frances, Mary Ann, Lee Jr., and James.

Emma completed the 11th grade at Apex School. After her schooling, she became a housekeeper for several families in the Town of Apex. She enjoyed being a blessing to the families that she helped daily. Emma never learned to drive nor owned a car. However, she was able to get wherever she needed to go and was always on time. She was a well traveled woman. She enjoyed traveling to various states and cruising with her last trip about 5 years ago.

Emma will be remembered by her contagious smile, laugh and positive attitude. She enjoyed spending time with her family, cooking, baking, and watching everyone enjoy her food. She was known for those "heavy" pound cakes.

She has seen a lot and have experienced a lot over the last 100 years. She had many stories of her childhood that she often recalled vividly. Emma was interviewed and featured in the book, "Pluck, Perseverance, and Paint: Apex, North Carolina: Beginnings to 1941." During these interviews she shared her stories of growing up in a Sharecroppers family.

She was preceded by death by her husband, Lee Council Sr., stepmother, Annie Tabron Jones, half-brother, Rev. Percy Jones, stepbrother, Zachriah Allen, and her granddaughter Angela Marshall.

Emma leaves to cherish her memories four children: Frances Coleman (Billy); Mary Ann Clay; Lee Council, Jr. (Annie); and James Council. She has seven grandchildren: Tanya Marshall, Berthold Marshall, Jr., Derrick Clay (Suzanne), Jamaine Walker, Shatania Clay, Cosandra Williams (Walter), and Lee Council, III.
