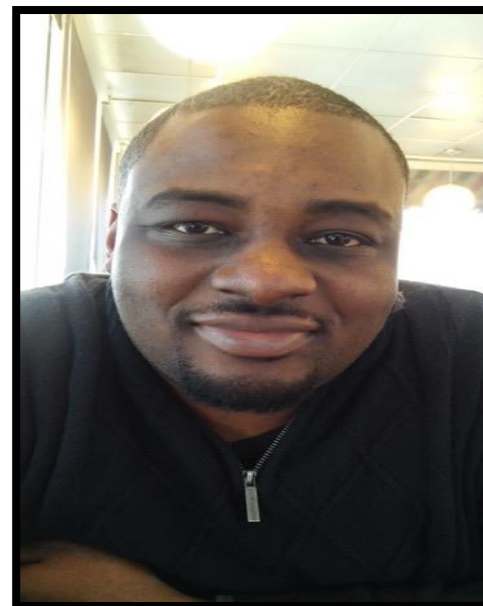

Dwayne had a passion for cars at an early age. He told stories of his father taking him to the race track. He moved to the United States with his mom and sister at the age of 11 and they built a life in Westchester, New York. His mom and sister were his life. Where you saw Dwayne, you saw Alisha. He took being his sister's protector very seriously. During his teens and twenties Dwayne could be found at work, at car meets with his friends or bar hopping throughout the tri-state area.

Dwayne met his wife Kelly in 2005. They had an instant connection. They were married in NYC on February 19, 2019. They welcomed their baby boy Aidan into the world May 23, 2019. Dwayne and his son instantly fell in love with each other and were inseparable. Dwayne loved and adored his family and friends. He had the uncanny ability to make friends while never having to say much. Dwayne had this *je ne sais quoi* about him that spoke volumes even when he was silent. He believed in accountability.
