Reverend Elouise Fuller

Faithful Worker in God’s Kingdom

This Senior Stateswoman and Pioneer was an Evangelist for 59 years. Full of God’s wisdom and His Holy Spirit, she lived a holy life fully dedicated to serving God and telling everyone of His goodness and salvation.

Scott’s Grove Holiness Church was the setting for Elouise’s initial Ordination by the United Church of America in 1955. In April, 1975, Elouise was issued a certification of license to preach from the White Oak Missionary Baptist Church and was ordained on March 27, 1977 by the Baptist Association. She has worked in various areas of ministry. They include, but not limited to prison ministry, youth ministry, community (hospital, rest home) ministry, bible study, and served as a hospital chaplain. Always striving to do better, Elouise satisfactorily completed all the courses in the Department of Continuing Education sponsored by the Shaw University Divinity School in Raleigh, NC. She has served on the Board of Advisors for the Western Wake Christian Ministry, and a Member of the NC Association for Women in Ministry.

Elouise was an active participant in her community by serving as a licensed day care operator, school advisory board member, head start teacher, and has run for Apex Commissioner, to name a few.

Rev. Fuller offered the following words for women in ministry today: “Women in ministry should seek spiritual growth. This consists of seeking God first and His righteousness (Matthew 6:33). This requires dedication, faithfulness, honesty, truthfulness, and bearing the Fruit of the Spirit in everything you do. You must be able to endure yourself for others to be inspired by your life. Women of God should work as a team and always embrace one another and share experiences. Everyone’s experience is different, but when we can say “I know” that it was God who brought me through my experience, then others may know that He can bring them through also. Rev. Fuller stated, “If you want to be kept by His divine grace, you must be in the position to say to God, I present my body as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to the Lord. (Romans 12:1). God called you by His anointed power, not by any merit of your own, but the power of the Almighty God.” Rev. Fuller truly believed that it is more blessed to give than to receive.

The Obituary

Reverend Elouise Louise Baldwin Fuller, born to the late Alvin and Meagher Baldwin, began this earthly life on July 24, 1931, in Cumberland County, North Carolina. On October 6, 2021, God dispatched his angels to call our beloved Mother Fuller from labor to reward.

Elouise (Pat) as she was fondly called, spent her early formative years in Holly Springs. She completed elementary school in Apex and attended Berry O’Kelly High School in the Method Community in Raleigh, NC.

On January 3, 1949, Elouise married her hometown sweetheart and schoolmate, John Lee Fuller. The union was blessed with twelve (12) children.

In September, 1952, at a very young age, Elouise answered the call from God to “preach the word.” Since that time, she remained faithful and true to her calling, touching many lives along the way.

Elouise was not only a faithful evangelist in her community, but also a loving wife and mother who helped her family financially by working outside of the home. Some of her numerous places of employment included Apex Manufacturing Company, Holly Springs Headstart Program, and she later retired from Hudson Belk Company as a salesperson in the Children’s Department, where each year she received the Meritorious Customer Service and Sales Achievement awards.

She was preceded in death by her son, John Earl Fuller, her sisters, Elene B. Farrington, Lucille B. Cousar Barkley, and Shirley B. Page, a brother, Arthur Pete Williams, and the love of her life, John Lee Fuller.
