

Sammie Lee Garris was born on March 5, 1957 to the late Moody Junior Garris and Veler Garris in Pittsboro, NC. He departed this life on October 3, 2022 at UNC Hospital in Chapel Hill, NC.

Sammie was educated in Wake County Schools and graduated from Apex High School in 1976.

Sammie has been a member of First Baptist Church New Hill since he was a little boy and gave his life to Christ at the age of 24 in 1981. A year later, he was ordained as a Deacon. He served as Superintendent of Sunday for 22 years, was a member of the male chorus, and was very active in other capacities of the church until his health began to decline. He was always willing to go the extra mile for anyone and let them know they were appreciated, loved, and remembered whether through giving a card, a phone call, or a visit. He always thought of others before he thought of himself.

Sammie truly had a servant's heart. In his spare time, he enjoyed going to car shows which featured old classic cars; his favorite was a '57 Chevy. Sammie enjoyed attending various church programs at other local churches, gospel concerts, and listening to old school music, such as Motown hits. He thoroughly enjoyed reading whether it was a newspaper, the Daily Bread, or the Bible. Sammie loved reading newspapers from different cities, states, etc. so if you told him you were traveling somewhere; he would ask you to bring him a newspaper from where you visited.

Sammie leaves a legacy of love and memories; his wife of almost 41 years, Deborah Garris. 










A brother, a husband, a father, a Deacon and a friend there are not enough adjectives to describe this Man of God Because his caring, like his advice, never ends!
