

## Obituary

On August 6, 1926, God blessed the Headen household with a new son. T. Ridie Headen and Massie L. Stone Headen welcomed this new arrival into a large, loving family. Fulton, as he was known, was family-focused from an early age. He was educated in Chatham County and decided as a very young man to enter the military and share his earnings with the family.

As a young soldier, Fulton was stationed in the South Pacific and served in the military until 1946. He returned to Chatham County and brought skills from his time in the military to his new employment as a lumber craftsman and mill worker in Swepsonville, NC. In the early 1950's he wed Mary Louise Alston (Polly) and simultaneously gained a daughter, Sandra Faye Alston Scurlock, whom he loved as his own. Mary preceded him in death in 1968. Sandra Faye also preceded him in death in 2006. His only grandson, Frederick A. Alston passed on in 2016.

Fulton returned as a young man to active membership at Mt. View AME Zion Church. He attended faithfully until he was not as mobile as he once was. His mobility was well-recognized by members of the Pittsboro community who regaled us with vivid accounts of his daily walks through town. Even the mayor of Pittsboro commemorated his steadfastness and consistency.

Steadfast and consistent love are just a few of the qualities that his family will remember in days to come. Carrying the legacy of his strength in love are his two brothers: George Ernest Stone and Dalton W. Stone. Never forgetting his love and care are his granddaughter, Jocelyn S. Brooks (Shawn) and their daughters, Samaya and Madelyn; as well as his beloved niece, Karla S. Eanes.
