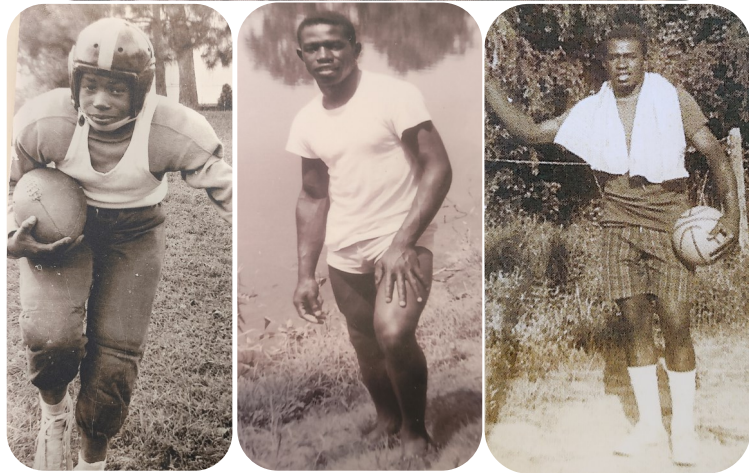
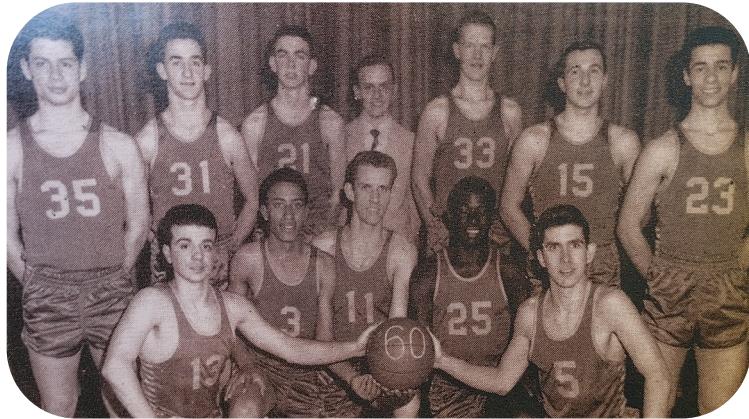

He was an avid 76ers and Philadelphia Eagles, Philadelphia Phillies Baseball Fan.

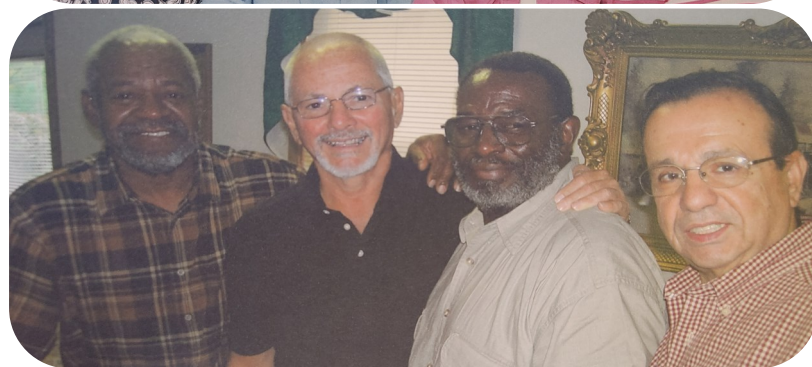
