OBITUARY



James Tinsley, Sr. was a native of Albany, Georgia. He was married to the late Delma Stoker Tinsley for 38 years and had four children. James attended high school at Nashville Christian Institute under the tutelage of Marshall Keeble. After graduation from NCI, he continued his education at Southwestern Christian College and the University of Nebraska, earning an Associate of Arts and a Bachelor of Science.

James began his ministry in 1955 at the Choctaw Avenue Church of Christ in Holdenville, Oklahoma. From 1956-1959 he ministered at the Moore Avenue Church of Christ in a school building in Bay City, Texas. The congregation consisted of 18 members with 17 being new converts. Under his leadership, the congregation grew to 80. Due to the expansion, the congregation constructed a 120-capacity building, the Sixth Street Church of Christ.

In 1959, J.S. Winston recommended James to the Pratt Street Church of Christ in Omaha, Nebraska. Through his efforts, God's grace, and walking by faith, Pratt Street advanced the cause for Christ. As the congregation continued to grow, two new buildings were erected, the 37th Street Church of Christ and the Fort Street Church Christ.

For several years, James hosted a radio and television ministry "Speaking the Truth in Love". The radio show broadcasted throughout Nebraska, Iowa, Minnesota, and Missouri. After he retired from Fort Street and relocated to the Dallas-Fort Worth area, he was a regular panelist on the television ministry "According to the Scriptures". James preached across the nation and authored three books; "Make the Crowd Sit Down" dedicated to his late wife, Delma; "The Stirred up Preacher" dedicated to his children; and "When the Wine Ran Out" dedicated to his daughter, Jamie. In 2007, the congregation built the James Tinsley Villas, a 28-unit affordable housing facility. The clubhouse was dedicated in honor of Delma Tinsley. In recognition of 50 years of ministry, the Omaha City Council proclaimed December 12, 2009 "Brother James Tinsley, Sr. Day" for his service to God and the Omaha community.

James had a great sense of humor. He loved to tell jokes, play pranks, and laugh. He liked sports, was an avid bowler and basketball player. His favorite teams were the Los Angeles Lakers, Los Angeles Dodgers, and eventually the Dallas Cowboys. He enjoyed fishing, playing dominoes, bid whist, spades, and board games.

James was predeceased by his wife Delma Tinsley, and mother Willie Vera Grace. He leaves to cherish his memory his children, Medina Gipson, Veta Christman, Jamie Tinsley, and James Tinsley, Jr (Yolanda); Sisters, Vera Harris (Ivan) and Andrea Lugo (Luis); Grandchildren, Ticia Tinsley, Tre Tinsley, Tori Tinsley, Tuan Tinsley, Tevan Christman, and Alexis Gipson; Great-grandchildren, Marcus Baker, and Amir Tinsley.
