of you that now lives in each of us.*

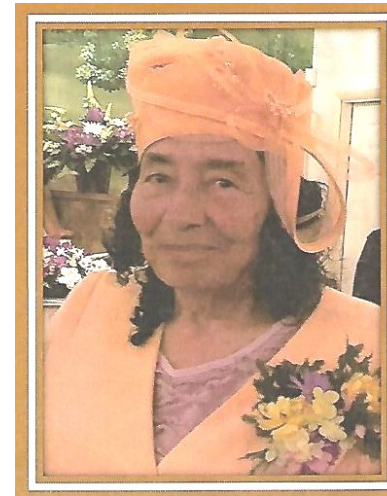

She completed her high school education at Fayetteville Technical Community College and took Nursing Aide training at Central Carolina Community College.

She was married to Bro. Charlie G. McNeill and to that union three children were born, Charlie Jr., Larry Tyrone and Gladys Elaine. Her husband and granddaughter Stephanie McNeill preceded her in death.

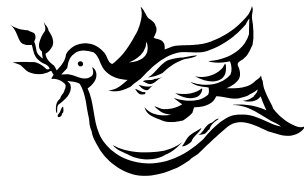
