



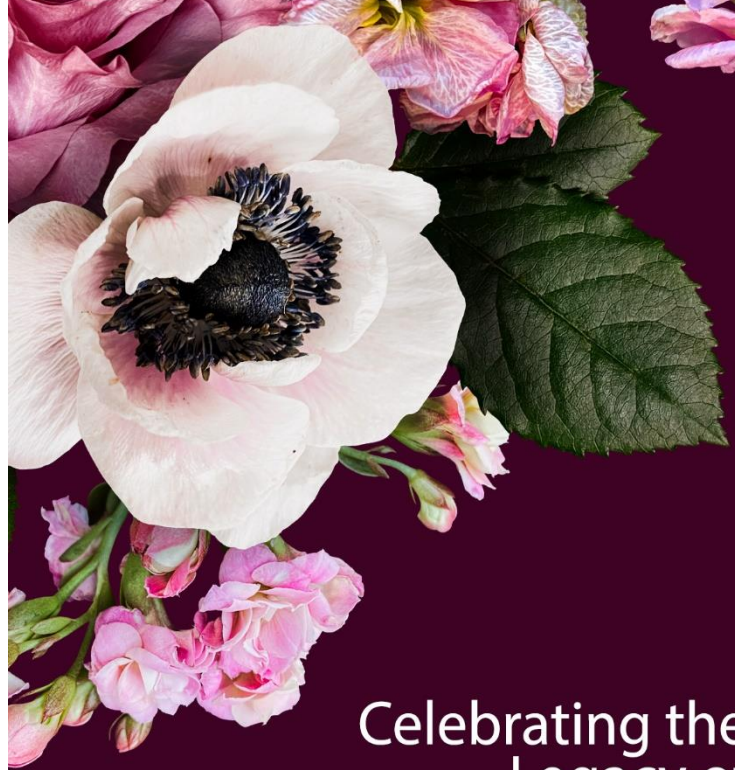
*Mothers Never Really Die -

Her Journey

Deaconess Brenda Louise Haynes Hubbard was born on Sunday night, December 19, 1965, on Goff Avenue, by a midwife. She was the second child born to Julius Haynes, Jr. and Mozelle Davis Haynes. "Sista", a nickname given by her brother who couldn't pronounce **Brenda**, was educated in Orangeburg.

She was a proud graduate of the 1984 class of Orangeburg-Wilkinson High School. She ran track and was most notable known for her skills as a majorette. Her plans after graduating were to attend nursing school but motherhood became her new focus. On November 30, 1984, she became the mother of her first son, Montez P. V. Haynes. As a new mother, she changed her career path and enrolled in cosmetology school. She was later worked as a group leader at Kirsch with the arrival of her second son, Ahkeem R. Haynes. She enjoyed motherhood and always referred to her sons as, "the boys".

In 1989, on her mom's birthday at a club called MP's (Yes, a club, lol.), she met the love of her life. Duane and **Brenda** were married on October 3, 1992, at Warren Chapel Baptist Church by Reverend A. C. Wright. After marriage she worked part time, occasionally braided hair, and worked with her sister in the salon shampooing hair and doing body wraps. She also operated a home daycare for many years. Her last employment was the Greater Orangeburg Funeral Home.

On Monday, November 21, 2022, at 10:45 p.m., surrounded by family her pain ended and healing began as she slipped away from earth to glory. Brenda was a woman of great faith. She devoted countless hours to studying the Word of God and was a prayer warrior. She was a member of Warren Chapel Baptist Church, where she was also baptized. **Brenda** was a member of the Young Adult Choir and lead several songs, such as, "Pouring Water on a Drowning Man" and "I Know I have Been Changed". She later moved her membership to Living Victory Church, where she was on numerous ministries and became a Deaconess. Her last membership for the past ten years has been at Life Cathedral Church, under the leadership of Overseer Antonio L. Gathers. She will be remembered there as a friendly greeter and her famous praise dance.

In her free time, she enjoyed bowling, dancing, and especially traveling. She has traveled extensively, participating in bowling tournaments and family trips.
