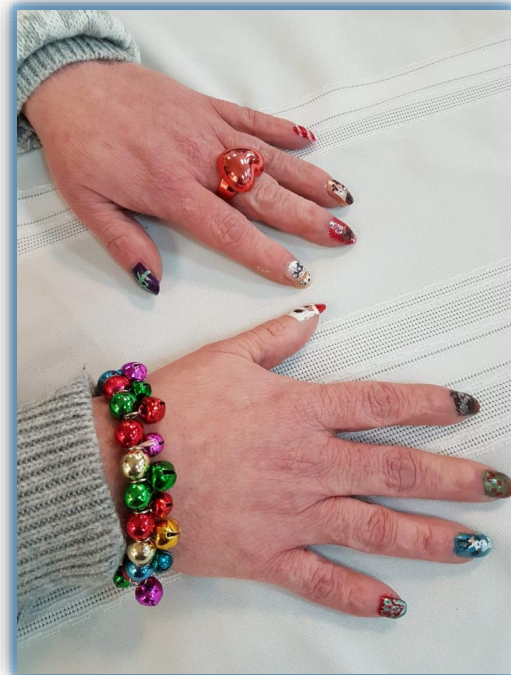
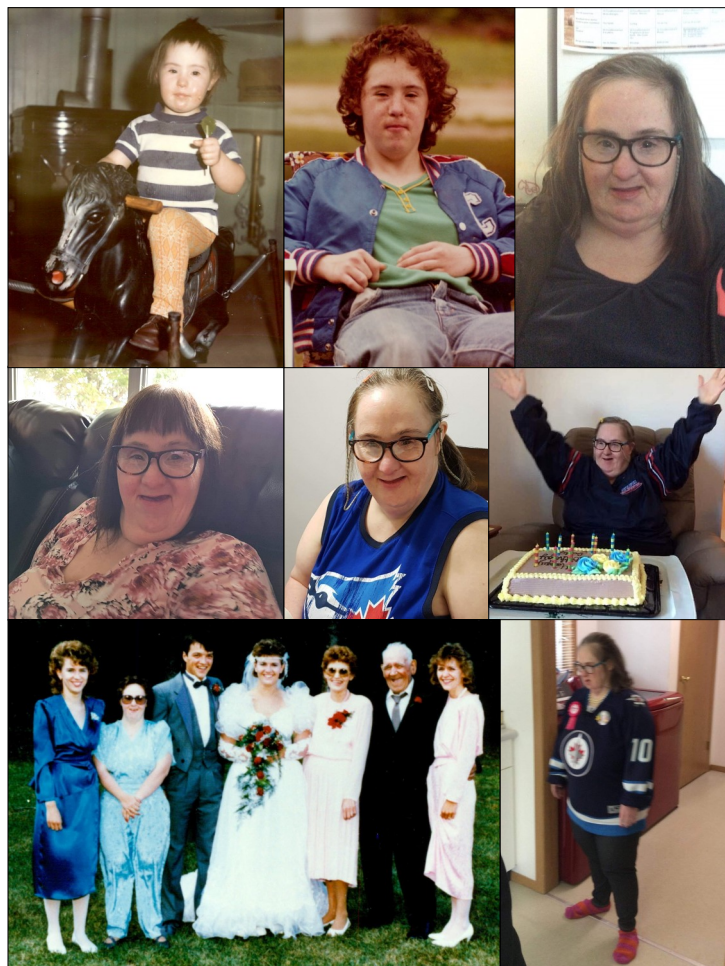




In Loving Memory of
