Marvin Glen "Special" Cox



Heaven's band received a new member on the morning of May 6, 2023. This was the day Bishop Marvin Cox became absent from this body, but we know that he is present with the Lord.

Early Life

On January 21, 1950, Leanna Sara and Milton Rodon Cox Sr. welcomed their third child, a baby boy, in the quiet settlement of Snug Corner, Acklins, one of the southernmost Bahamian islands. Because he was born prematurely at seven months, Marvin was called "Special" as a little boy, as was the customary nickname for premature babies. Marvin's early education started at the All-Age School in Snug Corner, Acklins. In 1961, Marvin moved to the capital, Nassau, Bahamas, with his grandmother. He continued his education at the Eastern Senior High School. After completing high school, he worked for his uncle Bishop Brice Thompson at a shop named Thriftway Supermarket. In 1969, he started working at the Bahamas Telecommunication Corporation (BTC) where he stayed for several years.

Marvin attended the Church of God of Prophecy where he played the cymbals as a member of the renowned Bahamas Brass Band. Additionally, he was a very gifted guitar player. A man of many talents, he also became a part of the popular singing group called the Golden Trumpeters. The Golden Trumpeters' first recorded album was titled "One Day He's Coming Again", followed by their second album titled "His Eye Is On The Sparrow". Their music continues to be played on the national radio station of the Bahamas.

Family, Life in the United States, and Ministry

Marvin met the beautiful Iva Mae Jacqueline Williams (Jackie) while attending a Church of God of Prophecy (COGOP) General Assembly. Initially, Jackie lived in Chicago, and Marvin lived in Nassau; however, distance made their hearts grow fonder, and they decided that they wanted to spend their lives together. They became engaged in 1970, and in 1975 they married. Their marriage produced a son, Carlon, followed by their daughter, Crystal. Marvin and Jackie enjoyed 48 years of marriage together before God called Marvin home.

In 1977 Marvin and Jackie moved to Chicago, Illinois where he immediately began serving at his father-in-law's church as a musician, as well as a Sunday School teacher and superintendent. He received his first Pastoral Appointment in 1982 to the Markham COGOP and was later appointed Pastor to the Evanston COGOP. He spent 10 years pastoring in Evanston, Illinois. His final Pastoral appointment was in Wisconsin at God's Miracle in Milwaukee COGOP where he served diligently for 17 years, during which time he was ordained as a Bishop in the COGOP. He retired in 2013.

While pastoring, he also worked as a supervisor in the Copy and Records Department for Carter & Company, the corporate arm of True Value Hardware. Nearly every year at Carter & Company, Marvin received an award for perfect attendance. Additionally, he worked at Integrity Family Services as a Crisis Stabilizer.

After retiring, he moved to Raleigh/Durham, North Carolina. Because of his love for studying and teaching the Word of God, as well as his love for the people of God, he served as Associate Pastor over the Seniors Ministry at Research Triangle Park (RTP) COGOP and faithfully conducted a Weekly Bible Study at his residence in Chapel Hill. We cherish memories of him making a joyful noise, faithfully serving God, fiercely loving his family, and working hard until the Lord called him home to rest.

Preceded in death by his parents and his brother, Frelon (Glenda) Cox, Marvin will forever be cherished in the heart of his beloved wife, Iva Mae Jacqueline (Jackie) Cox; his children Carlon Jerod (Tamira) and Crystal Nicole Cox, his grandchildren Taliyah, Carson, Aria, and William Alexander; his brothers Yelverton (Jennymae), Beauford, Milton Jr. Esq., Cardie, and Orville (Clarice) Cox; and his sisters Trudie Cox, Miriana Bethell, Evelina (Alexis) Wallace, and Dotlyn Cox. His nieces and nephews: Saron (Sharell), Caleb, Darcy, and Jade (Adena) Cox; Vashti (Andrew) Joseph, Kishtor and Lavade Cox; Doctors Charisse (Ian) Kelly, Sidney (Kessandra) and Cassie Esq. Bethell; Jenson, Pastor Breon, and Luke Cox; Alexia Esq. (Garrison) Best, Sydney Wallace; Jason and Chantal Cox; Camrawn Cox; Orvette Ross (Sean), Clydeshia, and Christian Cox. Also cherishing his memory are Marvin's in-laws, cousins, church families, and dear friends.

Bishop Marvin Glen "Special" Cox passed away at the age of 73 and will be remembered for the love he had for God, his beloved family, and quartet gospel music. Our beloved Marvin has transitioned from labor to reward.


