OBITUARY

Reverend Parvin J. Neloms was born on June 14, 1946, to the late Mr. and Mrs. Percy Neloms, Sr., of Leighton, Alabama. He departed his life on May 23, 2022, at the North Alabama Medical Center in Florence, Alabama.

He attained his early education at Leighton Training School in Leighton, Alabama. He was a member of the class of 1967. He also attended Birmingham Baptist College in Birmingham, Alabama.

He accepted Christ at an early age and joined Cave Spring Missionary Baptist Church, where he served as a deacon and a member of the male choir.

In 1984, he acknowledged his calling to preach the Word of God. That same year he joined St. Peter Missionary Baptist Church of Tishomingo, Mississippi, where he pastored for three years. After three years, the Lord sent him to pastor the Eleventh Grove Missionary Baptist Church in Florence, Alabama for twenty-one years.
