

## **Obituary**

In the early hours of December 10, 2021, Eunice Robinson Evans was carried to her heavenly home by her guardian angel.

Eunice Evans was born on June 13, 1943, in Harlem, NY to the late Frank and Mary Ann Robinson. Eunice attended the public school system in NYC. She attended Jane Addams Vocational High School in the Bronx, NY and in 1961 graduated as a Licensed Practical Nurse. She worked as an LPN for several years at both Knickerbocker Hospital and Harlem Hospital in the intensive care unit for both hospitals. She decided to return to school and attended Bronx Community College receiving an Associate Degree of Science in Nursing in 1970 and obtaining her RN license. Eunice spread her wings and continued to work at Harlem Hospital remaining in ICU, Rikers Island jail complex, and Reality House drug rehab facility. She and other nursing classmates decided to enroll in a Nurse Practitioner program however, before completion, a family decision was made to move to Bennettsville, SC.

Eunice was employed with Marlboro General Hospital and the later Marlboro Park Hospital in the role of the Director of ICU and House Supervisor. After working many years in a supervisory role, she decided to return to bedside nursing. She gained employment with Saint Eugene Medical Center later becoming McLeod Health Dillon. Eunice remained in intensive care caring for the sickest of the sick. She obtained a Certificate of Recognition from the Medical University of South Carolina School of Nursing for preceptorship and retired from nursing in 2008. Many knew Eunice as a professional nurse in her starched white dress, hosiery, and hat. She was proud to be a Registered Nurse and it showed. She was a patient advocate and leader to the end of her career.

She is a proud member of Shiloh Baptist church and of the Nannie Edwards Missionary Ministry.

Eunice was preceded in death by her brothers Frank and David Robinson and Quaslim Inham and sister Almeara Robinson.
