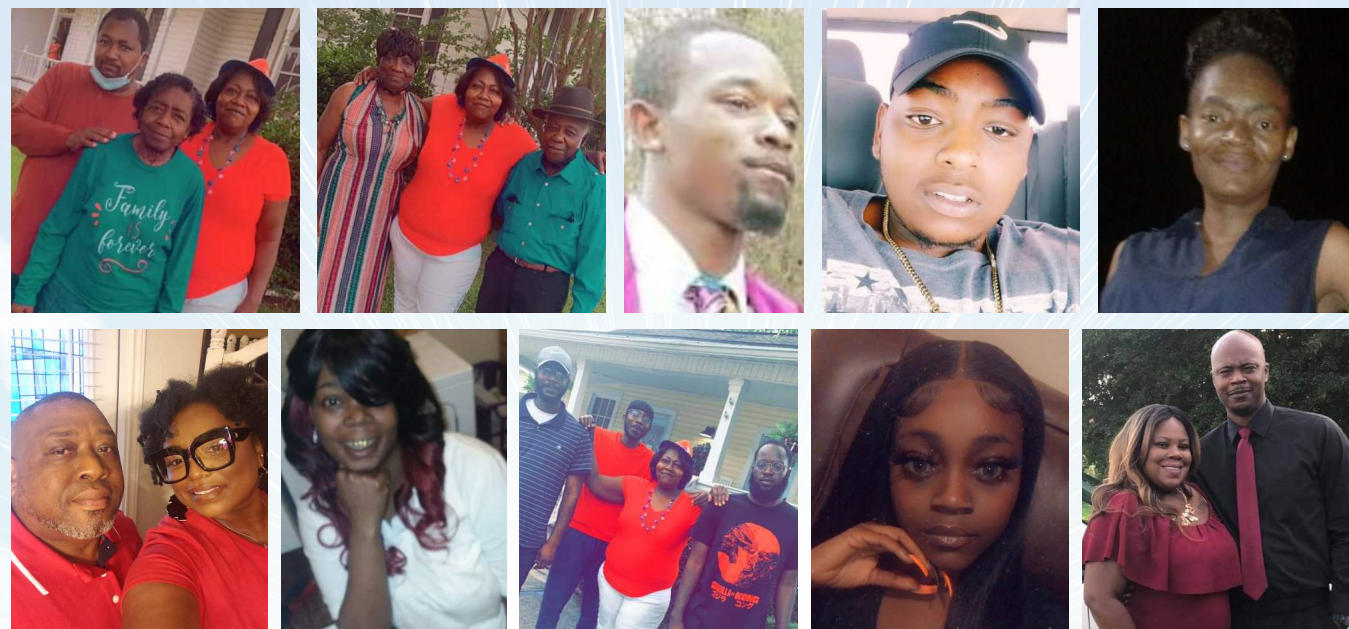
She religiously attended her church services where she would enjoy singing and worshipping God. Bertha also loved fishing and spending time with her great-grandkids.
