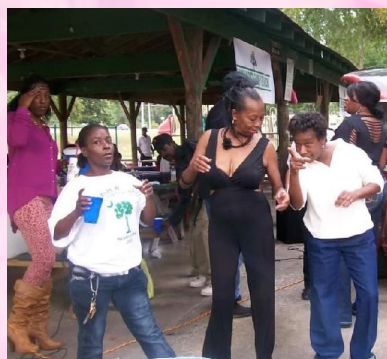




## *Precious Memories*
