Our beloved Moanick Ann Fenner was born on June 28, 1965 to John and Carolyn Fenner in Roanoke Rapids, North Carolina. She was the first born of three sisters and one brother. She gained her heavenly wings on December 16, 2021. Moanick dedicated her life to Christ at an early age.

Soon after, the family relocated to Washington, DC. This is where she received her formal education. Moanick attended C.W. Harris Elementary, Fletcher-Johnson Junior High, and H.D. Woodson High School. She was a very active student. One of her most memorable moments during high school that she often reminisced about was her role as a majorette with the notable H.D. Woodson Marching Band. She often spoke about the discipline, hard work and dedication it took to be a part of the team. Her enthusiasm for performing and her talent for showmanship is what shaped her legacy within her own family. Moanick completed graduated with the Class of 1983.

Moanick began working in a program during her senior year as a student trainee. After graduation she was hired full-time. Her professional career was prosperous and it spanned nearly forty years. She spent twenty years of her career fulfilling duties as a Military Personnel Specialist for the Department of the Navy and as an Administrative Officer for the Department of the Army. She received several service and performance awards during her tenure. She also dedicated another ten years to various federal government contracting companies in the Washington, D.C. area as a Management & Administrative Assistant. She transitioned successfully from government to private sector fulfilling duties that aligned with the experience she gained previously.

Moanick's personal life was just as remarkable as her career. She had four children: Ayanna, Tyanna, Pierre, and Benjy. She was a devoted mom who gave much her time to her family which also included her nieces and nephews. She embodied the spirit of a Team Mom. It was her love and enthusiasm for team performance and showmanship that helped shape the activities in her immediate family. She used sports, karate, family gatherings, and other extracurricular activities to help teach life skills. Moanick had all her kids involved in several competitive sports simultaneously. At any given time she would be managing multiple practice schedules at once. It was not unheard of for Moanick to be up and down the road and flying the friendly skies supporting these events. After her kids became adults and started families of their own, she poured her time into her grandchildren. Her grandchildren took the torch to become her new side-kicks always traveling in tow. Moanick was very proud of her children and their many accomplishments.

Her home and heart were always open to family and friends. She devoted her life to the safety, security, and support of individuals connected to her, her children, and her family. She loved her parents dearly and visited them almost daily. Moanick made it a priority to lead with love, compassion and affection for her sisters. She was perpetually present to offer guidance, wisdom, encouragement, comfort, and hope for any situation appropriately. She is affectionately known to family and friends as Nick. Moanick always presented herself well and hair was always fashionably ready. A bad hair day was unheard of. She enjoyed shopping, traveling with her family, get-togethers, and hanging out with friends listening to live music visiting family in North Carolina. She spent quality much time with her close companion Anthony (Tony) Hicklin who has been very supportive of her. She had a special relationship with her cousin Freda Creek and close friend Angelique Williams.

Moanick's experienced devastation after suddenly losing her 16 year-old son Benjy (2016) and 29 year-old son Pierre (2018). She pushed through and found solace in the loving memories of her boys and comfort through prayer and the presence of family and close friends.
