ELDER THOMAS K. STONE, SR. was a phenomenal man of noble character who worked tirelessly to support his family, community, and church. He went above and beyond for others. He was selfless, honest, righteous, and a generous man who never complained even during his illness. He was a loving, supportive, tower of quiet strength for his wife. He was an excellent husband, father, grandfather, and godfather, son, brother, family became faithful and dedicated members uncle, cousin, and friend. He was an awesome provider creating a home of comfort and order with laughter. He was a strict disciplinarian with a soft and gentle voice and he raised his children with love, dignity, and respect.

ELDER THOMAS K. STONE, SR. loved to read and listen to quartet musical groups. His favorite sports were football and basketball and he was

the family master chef of barbequing. His favorite Western Movie was Gun Smoke and his favorite TV show was In the Heat of the Night. Every night, he craved his favorite snacks: ice cream, honey buns, and popsicles. 
