In 1985, Jr. moved to Cincinnati, OH where he continued his career as a contractor remodeling many churches such as Greater New Life and Rose Chapel.

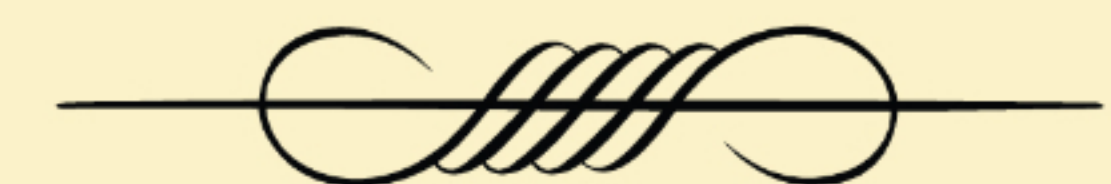
