

Delvin was educated in the Orangeburg County Public School System. He was a graduating member of the class of 1996, graduating from Orangeburg Wilkinson High School. During his tenure in school, Delvin was very active in athletics participating in football, baseball and as you may know, music was surely in his journey. He was an active member in the Gospel Chorus throughout high school. He received many accolades in music and sports. Delvin was voted "Most Talented" in the Senior Superlatives.

Delvin decided to further his education by attending Orangeburg-Calhoun Technical College, receiving his Associates Degree in Automotive.
