CARRIE LEE WINDHAM ROGERS, daughter of the late Deacon Charlie Windham, Sr. and Carrie Durant Windham, was born on January 11, 1928 in Sumter County. She went home to be with the Lord on Thursday, March 28, 2019 at age 91.

Mrs. Rogers, affectionately known as Delphine, attended the local schools of Sumter County. She accepted Christ at an early age at the Joshua Baptist Church where she served faithfully until recently when a brief illness prevented her from attending.

On August 5, 1950, she was united in holy matrimony to the late James Rogers and to this union, five children were born.

She was a faithful member of the Gospel Choir, Missionary Society, the Trustee Wives and the Sunday Church School for many years.

Delphine was a homemaker most of her adult life. She would take on tasks such as quilting, baking, sewing, gardening, canning, farming and making the best biscuits.
