

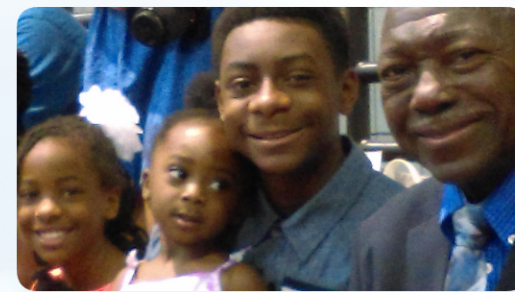
23rd Psalm

Obituary

Roy Duett was born from the union of Thomas Duett & Zenobia Frazier on August 7, 1936 in Cincinnati, OH. He was raised in the Dunbar community, now known as Madisonville.

He attended Withrow High School, before starting a career with the Cincinnati Board of Education in 1963. After beginning as a janitor, Roy furthered his education in engineering, and worked the next 35 years as a plant operator.

Throughout his life, Roy served and was heavily involved in the Madisonville community. He loved attending the annual Dunbar Day picnic and used it as an opportunity to introduce family to friends.

Roy formed a relationship with Christ and was baptized at an early age at New Mission Baptist Church. Later on, he became a loyal member of Second Baptist Church, where he attended for over 25 years. Over that time, he was a trustee, an active deacon, and a member of the choir. Roy had no issues sharing to others his relationship with the Lord and would often cite the Lord as the reason he had the strength to overcome darker days.

Roy had many hobbies and passions that gave him joy over the years, including bowling, billiards, photography, and drumming. He was the drummer for the Ohio Players and filled in for a James Brown set during a stop in Cincinnati. His stage name as a drummer was "Rico".

Roy married Laura Duett in 1963 and from that union two children were born.

Preceding him in death were three brothers, Thomas Duett (Jane), Jerry Duett, and Robert Duett (Rose); four sisters, Elizabeth Embry (Willis), Marjorie Young (Earl), Lucy Duett (Clifford), and Carolyn George (Clarence).

Surviving him in death are: daughters, Dawn Duett (Tony) and Veronica Jackson-Malone; son Thomas Duett; grandchildren, Vernon Duett (Tiara), Christopher Duett, and Jermaine Jackson, eight great grandchildren and a host of nieces, nephews, other relatives and friends.
