Obituary

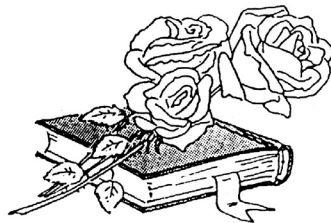
Mrs. Rosa M. Oxner, age 88, passed away on Monday, February 15, 2021.
