Our hearts still whispering, Thou art near!

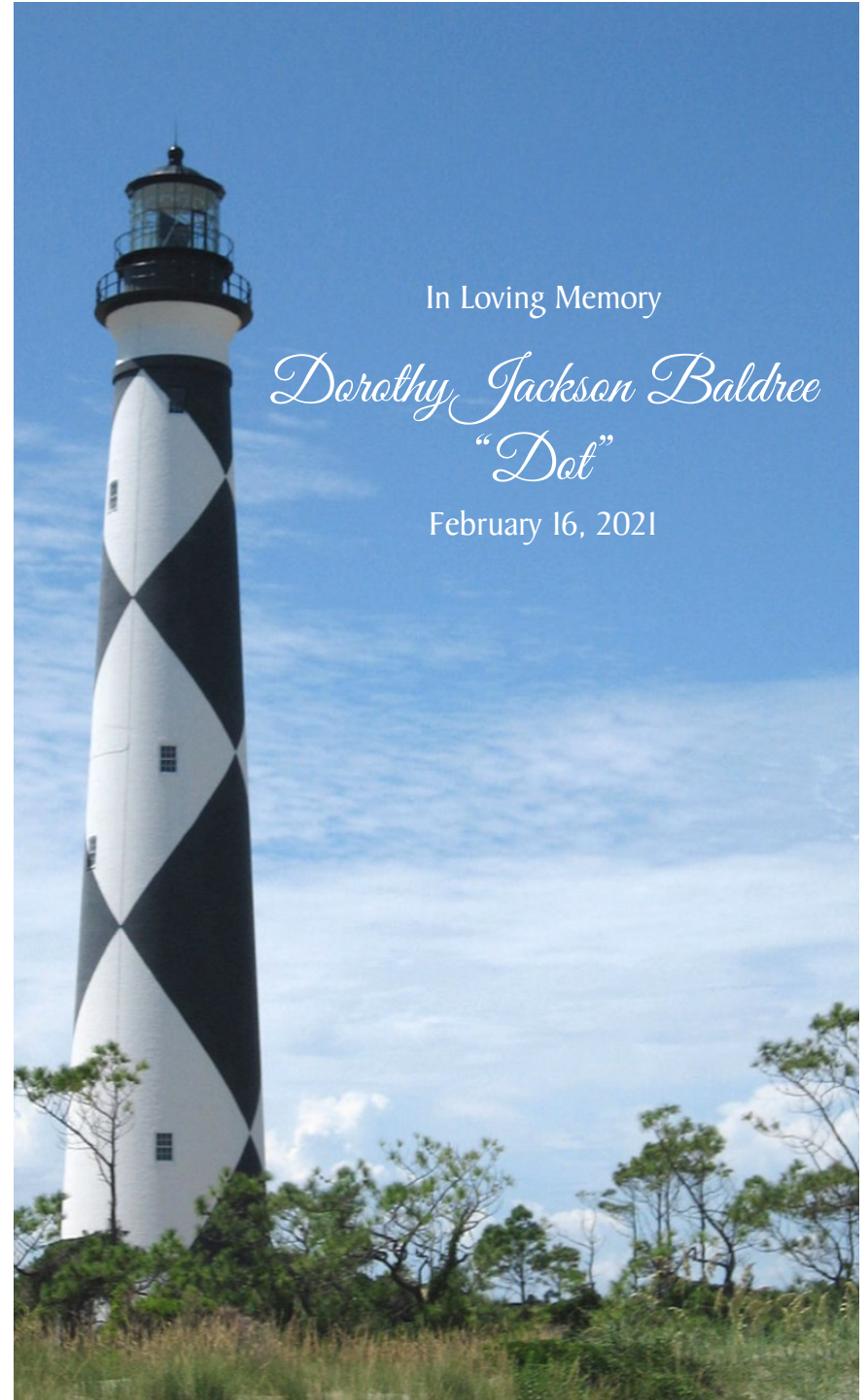
When drooping pleasure turns to grief,
