Go with us as we seek to defend the defenseless and to free the enslayed.



## **Obiluary**

Major Thomas Powell enlisted in the United States Army on June 30, 1965 and graduated as a Special Forces Combat Engineer Sergeant. He served 2 tours in Vietnam, during which the Joint Task Force assembled to rescue United States prisoners of war at Son Tay, N. Vietnam. His actions in this raid earned him the Distinguished Service Cross. He volunteered and graduated from US Army Ranger school. His career overseas continued to advance as a Special Forces Officer.

His final assignment before retirement was 1st office in charge at the field phase of the SERE school and then working with the field portion of the Special Forces Qualifications Course. After 22 years of Military service, he worked as a Research Analysis for the Joint Special Operations Command. During time he was deployed in support of the United States Special Operations in Panama for operation JUST CAUSE. Additional career awards and decorations include Bronze Star, Meritorious Service Metal, Army Commendation and V-device (all with Oak leaf cluster). Both Combat Infantryman and Master Parachutist Badges and the Special Forces and Ranger Tabs. Most recently, prior to his Civil Service retirement he was inducted into the Special Forces Regiment and into the Commando Hall of Honor.

Retired Major Powell spent a lifetime of unwavering loyalty and dedication to his duty, to all those he served with and for his country.
