Laugh as we always laughed at the little jokes we enjoyed together.


Play, smile, think of me.

Charles William "MacGyver" Gibbons, 63, passed away quietly at this home in Fayetteville, Sunday, April 29, 2018. He had suffered a stroke in March and had been in rehabilitation for a month. He was able to come home Wednesday the 25th of April. He was still disoriented and unsure of himself and his surroundings but recognized his beloved cats, Giga and Mindy.

Charles was born September 14, 1954 at Ft. Benning, Ga., the son of John Paul and Helen Eileen (Wimer) Gibbons. He moved to Fayetteville when he was very young and lived here until his death.

Charles graduated from Morganton School for the Deaf in 1975. He worked in the laundry department of the VA Hospital in Fayetteville for 20 years until he retired on disability. For several years as a young man he was part of an all-deaf pit crew for Keith Smith, who raced stock cars. He was active for many years in a Sunday night bowling league at B & B Lanes with his best friend, the late Ron Owens. Most recently he has been a member of the Sexy Seniors Bowling League at North View Lanes.

He married his wife, the former Carolyn Nora Watkins on September 15, 1991 in Hope Mills.

Charles was a caring husband and a good friend, with wonderful sense of humor. He loved animals and had a special relationship with them. He loved the American eagle; one of his fondest memories was visiting the Carolina Raptor Center at Huntersville, NC, and having "a day with a keeper" where he got to feed one of the eagles. He was an ardent supporter of all first responders.

Charles took great joy in life and he will be greatly missed by all who knew him.
