you, while the angels sing a heavenly song.

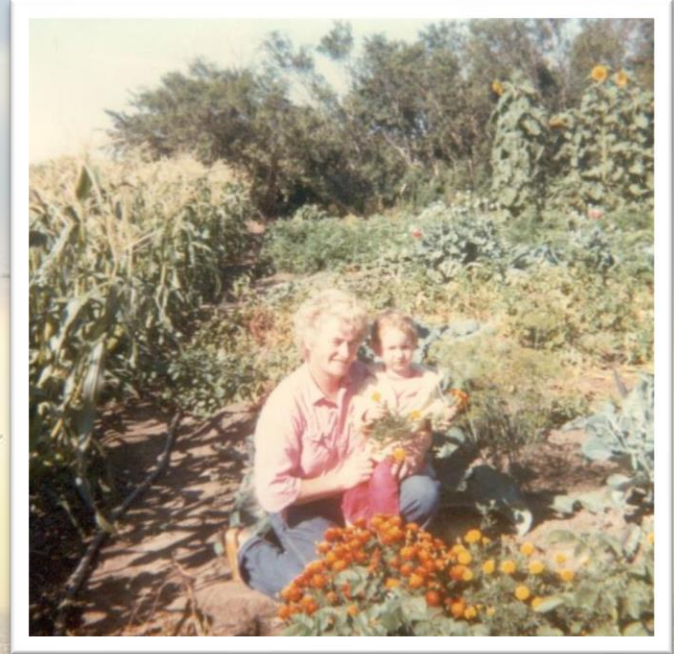
I am not alone, all who went before me
