
He never looked for praises

1934 - 2020

Harry Wiebe passed away at The Meadows in Swift Current, February 19, 2020 with his family by his side. Harry was born September 21, 1934 at home 5-14-13-west 3rd, near Wymark, Saskatchewan, the youngest child of John and Maria (Dyck) Wiebe.

At an early age Harry began his working career. He left home at age 14 to go to Alberta for one year and began a journey that never really stopped. His early years saw him work for several farmers, stoking grain bundles and reliving the stories over and over about sleeping in the barns haylofts with mice crawling all over. Life was not easy, but Harry did have the determination to work hard and become successful.

Harry was baptized at the Rosenhof Sommerfeld Mennonite Church in 1953 by Reverend David Wall. Harry married Susan Banman, August 29, 1954 in Rosenhof, SK.

He worked at several service stations in Swift Current and at some point, even owned his own. After this Harry moved into the construction business owning gravel trucks and caterpillar crawlers. This company began in 1981 and became a very successful operation under his leadership. He sold the company and retired in 1998; or so we thought! He just had to get out of the house (mom said so) and do something and so he began this operation to go alongside his landfill contracting business. This business was sold in 2007 and retirement set in. Harry did suffer a major heart attack, which slowed the entrepreneurial spirit some, and life slowed down for the first time and he began to enjoy his 'relaxed' time.

Never to be a great one for the Arts, he did participate in his grandchildren's band festivals, dance recitals, school plays, and hockey games. Although Harry didn't have many hobbies other than looking after his shop, he did find the Bronco hockey games enjoyable.
