Karen will be dearly missed by the many individuals and groups that she donated much of her time and blessings to. Karen was predeceased by her daughter, Rebecca "Becky" Wiebe; her parents, Loyd & Justina Mattice; her parents-in-law, Albert & Josephine Aman; and by her sister-in-law, Donna Aman.

Mom was born October 10, 1965 – the youngest of three and only daughter to Justina (nee Froese) and Loyd Mattice. From nearly the moment she arrived home, she exuded grace and kindness in everything, navigating many struggles with these enduring qualities. Out of financial necessity, her childhood allowed for appreciation of the less elegant things in life, rooting her love of the everyday moments. As a young child, the wonder of seeing the cracks in the sidewalk after receiving her first pair of glasses or opening the window to hear the birds sing when she had tubes placed in her ears, were some of the precious memories often recalled. January 10, 1998 she walked down the aisle (in the dress she let her daughter pick) and married her best friend and companion, Ralph. Together, they blended and grew their family, building a life of love, faith, and generosity. A perfect match. Above all, Mom was passionate about the Lord and found much peace in reading her bible and living her faith to the fullest.
