She began peritoneal dialysis which was a grueling 9 hours a day, seven days a week treatment. Despite this setback, Paula continued being a great student, a decorated

cheerleader, a great daughter, sister, cousin, and friend all while blessing others along the way.

She attended three years at Morgan State University of Baltimore Maryland; later receiving the job of a life-time with Flavorx Inc. Paula enjoyed her job, for she was surrounded by the best CEO Stewart Amos, the best coworkers featuring Brian Berger and the crew. Paula loved her job and was appreciative of the unconditional care and concern. Paula was a true fighter with years of surgeries, setbacks, and struggles she prevailed with style, grace, and a little bit of swag.

Her spirit was illuminating, bright, and beautiful. Paula's loving friends, family and anyone who came in contact adored her and she them. One of her favorite things to do besides root for the Washington, Redskins, Paula enjoyed running errands for her Grandpa James Brown when he was alive, also she loved spending time with her family and hanging out with friends.

Someone as special as Paula, we all knew that there has to be someone who was specially sent, made, created for such an amazing young woman. Someone out there that would love and adore her, scars and all, and through her mother's prayers God sent Paula a cupid, Mr. Kerwin Cupid. Her dog Casper, another addition of love to her life, also brought Paula true happiness and comfort.

She graduated with honors on 5/12/17. The battle was not hers but the Lords and now she in battle with him. Paula is and always will be an example for her family who will truly miss her, but she is set free. Free of her pain, poking, and prodding. She was the best and loved life to the fullest. She had and has many special gifts that have now been honored in Heaven. Hallelujah, Praise the Lord!
