

## Obituary

A much-loved wife, mother, grandmother, daughter, sister, and aunt, Catherine Grayton-Lee, 77, of Washington, D.C., passed away peacefully at Howard University Hospital on Monday, February 3, 2020, with her family present. She fought long and hard, dealing with several illnesses. She was born September 11, 1942, to Joseph Mason and Catherine Broome-Mason in Washington, D.C. She had eight (8) siblings, Barbara Ann Mason-Martin, Joseph Mason, Jr., (deceased), Francis Lugene Mason, Shirley Matthew, Tony Mason, Sr., John Purnel Mason, Sr., Arvil Mason (deceased), and Kevin Brown. A new journey landed her in Rosedale, the Northeast section of Washington, D.C. She grew up on Kramer Street, the same block where the Grayton Family lived - just a few doors down. She met Memnar Grayton and they were inseparable, creating a life of promise. While pregnant in 1960, she graduated from Eastern High School - "Rambler for Life" and gave birth to her and Memnar's first son, Begat James Cornelius Grayton. She grew up in the Catholic Church and was a faithful Catholic. She married Memnar in 1963 and begat Memnar Grayton in 1963, and Anthony Maurice Grayton in 1966. Throughout her lifetime Catherine loved music, dancing, reading, and movies. She loved all kinds of music, especially R&B music - her favorite. She loved hand dancing and could rip any floor up. She had a crush on Lil Anthony of the singing group "Lil Anthony and Imperials." She would take her kids to concerts, and even received a kiss from the lead singer of the Dells, Marvin, while rushing the stage and holding her sons James, Memnar, and Anthony at Howard Theatre. She was an avid reader, especially anything concerning Black History - because she loved her Black Culture. After living with her mother-in-law, Fronie Grayton on 15th Street Northeast for a brief time, she and Memnar relocated to the Brentwood Section of Northeast, D.C., and then to the Langdon Park Section of Northeast, D.C., where she resided for the past 46 years. After her marriage with Memnar ended, Catherine met a kind, caring, and loving man, Henry Edward Lee. She and Henry were married in 2001, creating a life of love until her passing.

In her professional life, she always served with a faith filled, Catholic Spirit, as a secretary, dietician, waitress, bank teller, and administration assistant. She worked for several major companies in the Washington Metropolitan Area, such as Mays Construction, Suburban Trust Bank, Sovereign Bank, Bank of America, Chevy Chase Bank, Hungry Herman, Jerry's Sub Shop, and Fannie Mae. During her time at Suburban Bank in the 70's, she met Jo Ann Campbell who became her best friend. They were like peas in a pod – if you saw Sug, you saw Jo Ann. She treated Jo Ann like her sister, and that's how her entire family treated Jo Ann – like a sister and aunt. Catherine was like a grandmother to Jo Ann's kids, Kamesa Patrick and Rodney Campbell, Jr. (Godson).

She loved everybody, every culture, and every race. She opened her arms to the LGBTQ community before there was such an acronym. She threw parties at her home for the Queens (the common phrased used back then) to showcase their talents in private settings without being questioned about their sexuality. She touched all that graced her presence with wisdom in an outspoken and spiritual way.

She celebrated a life through music, dance, movies, advocacy, advice, and strength in God. She instilled the word of God into her sons and ensured that they were raised and practiced the Catholic Faith at a high standard. Her life's motto: "Treat people right and they will treat you right."

Catherine is survived by her husband of 18 years and 2 months, Henry E. Lee of Washington, D.C.; sons, James Grayton (Christina), Memnar M. Grayton, and Anthony M. 
