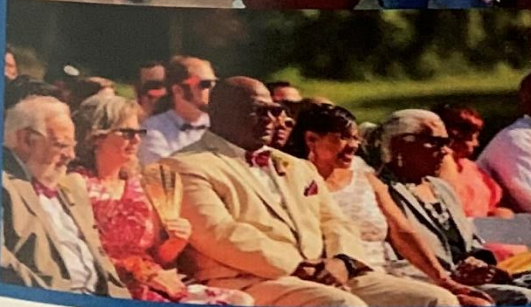
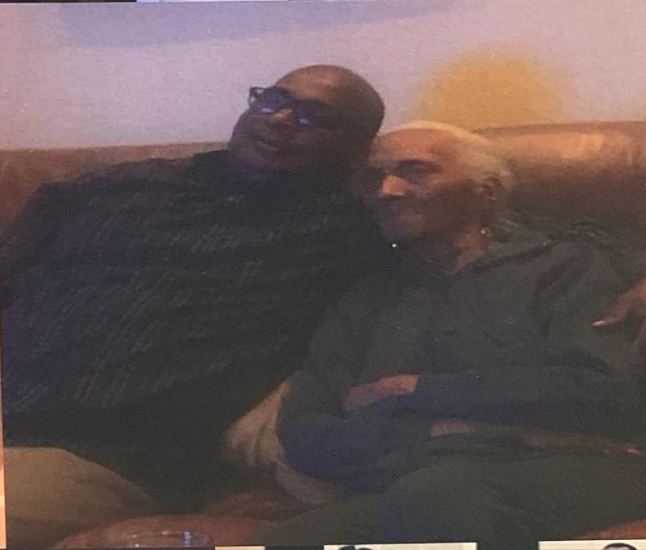


To my Family and Friends,
