Earl Dorsey Day, Jr., of Upper Marlboro, Maryland age 77 born on January 9, 1944, in Gum Springs, Virginia, transitioned from this life on Monday September 20, 2021, after a brief battle with Kidney Failure to one with his Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. 




