The Obituary

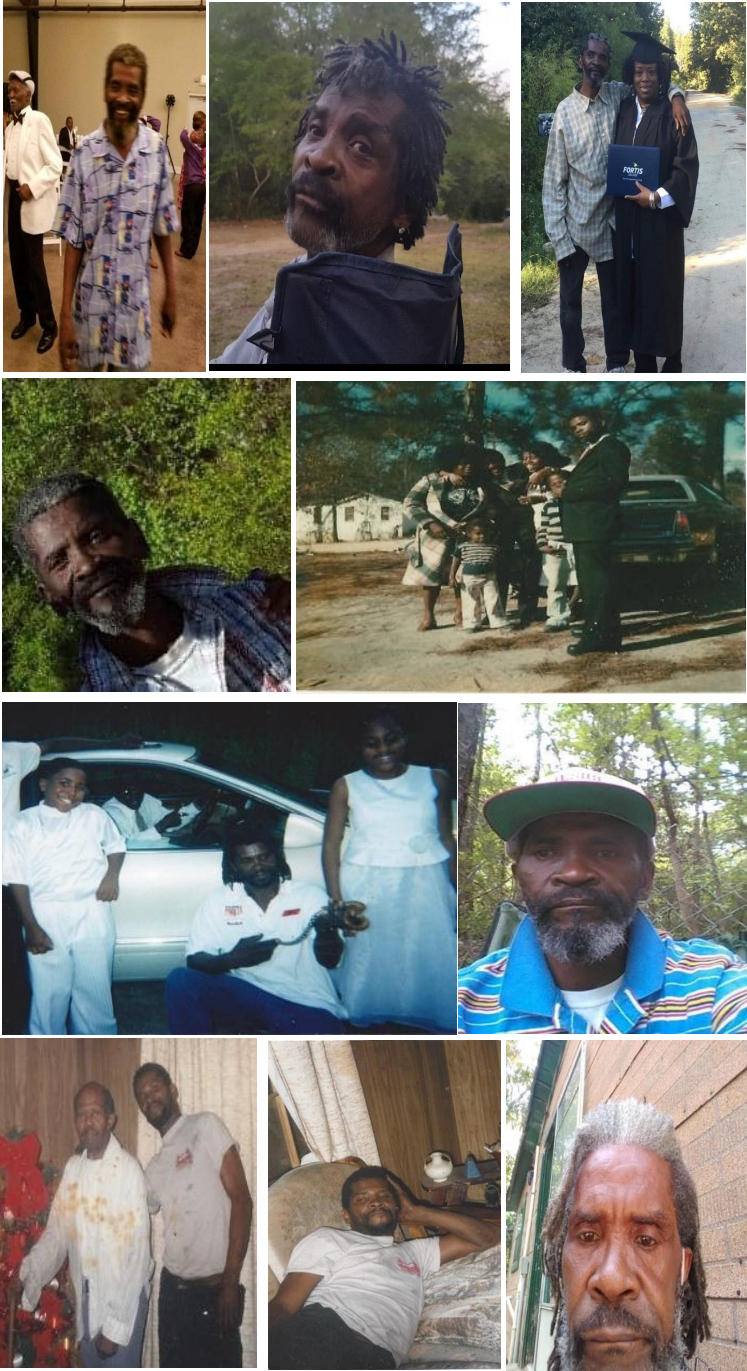
