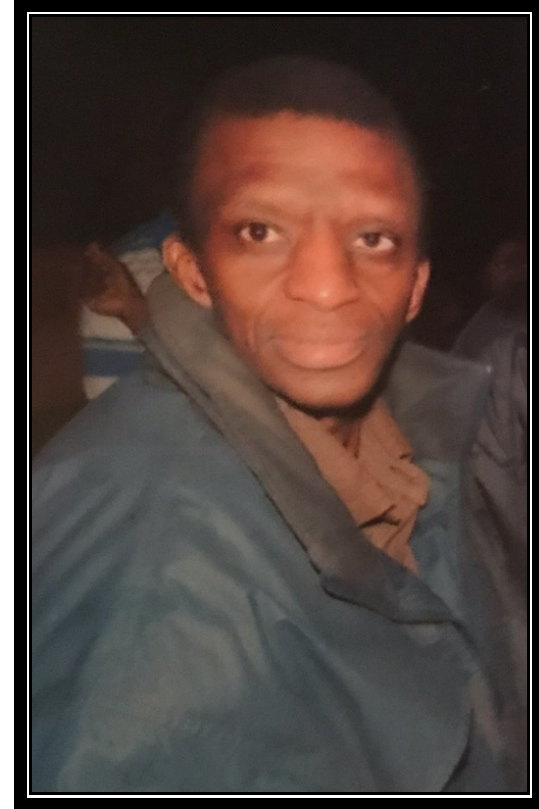

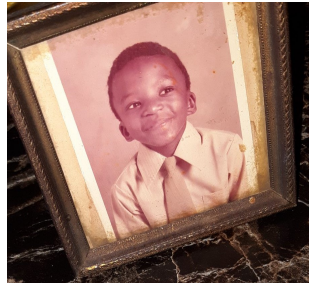
The Obituary
