Obituary

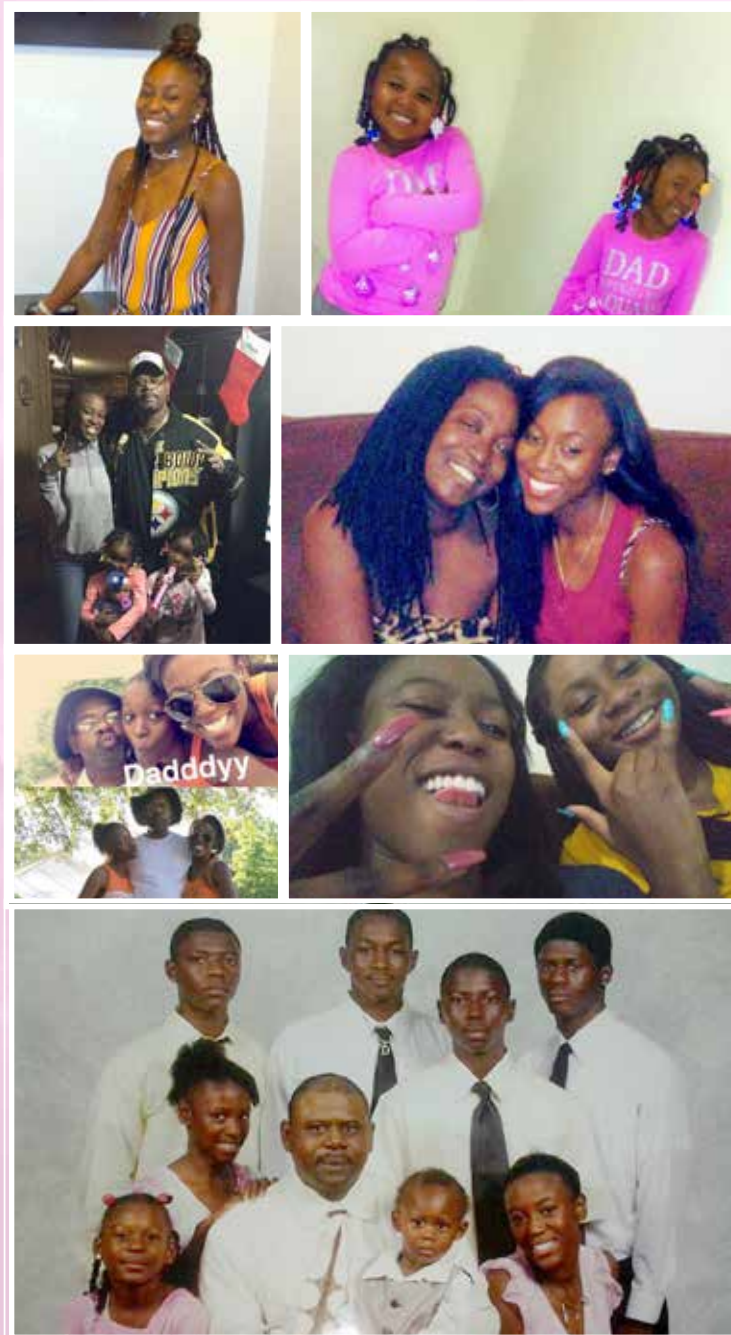
