Helen was a former resident of Freehold where she grew up and graduated Freehold Regional High School before moving to Lakewood, New Jersey. Helen was the daughter of the late Charles E. Sr. and Anna P. Davis. She overcame a long and courageous battle of Alzheimer's and Cancer.

Helen was a talented singer as she grew up in the Second Baptist Church of Freehold youth choir and was lead singer on many occasions. Freehold was the hub for cultivating musicians and athletes. Growing up on Lockwood Ave. in Freehold was a wholesome and unique experience. Exposed to many helpful elders in which gave wisdom and direction needed to develop a formidable personality. As a youth Helen enjoyed many years of Brownies and Girl Scouts in the Freehold area. Freehold afforded its youth with such learning opportunities as Summer Music School where Helen learned to play the clarinet coupled with her vocal abilities and every summer she participated in the community Vacation Bible School where along with Sunday school received her initial biblical education.
