Mrs. Clark has had many honors, one of the most honorable was the renaming of the Garfield School to Audrey W Clark School which was voted on unanimously by Long Branch Board of Education. Lastly Mrs. Clark was also co-proprietor with her husband of the Eastern Shore Community Agency until his passing in July of 2008.

Mrs. Clark as the choir director of many churches in Monmouth County, the last being at the Bethel AME Church. Active member on many boards within Bethel of which she took great pride in her church family.
