Obituary

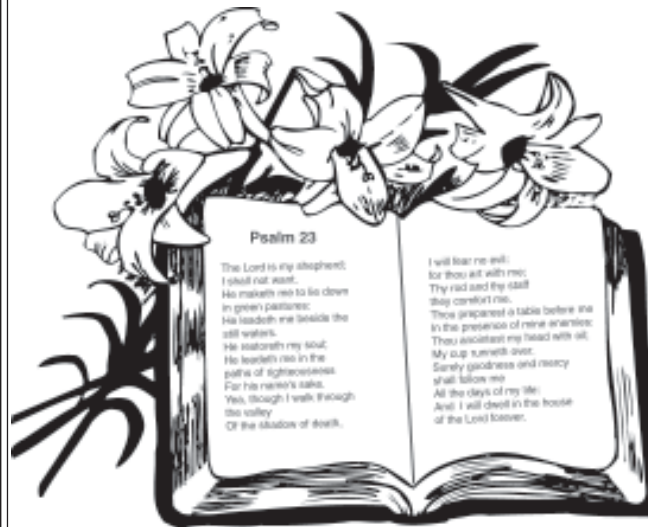
God has plucked a flower and called her home.
