

The Life and Legacy Of

Reverend Rosette D. Gallman

WIFE • MOTHER • GRANDMOTHER • PASTOR

Almighty God in His wisdom and divine providence saw fit to call home His faithful, devoted child from worldly cares to reward. Reverend Rosette D. Gallman (68), of 116 Byrd St, Prosperity, S.C., departed this life on Wednesday, July 22, 2020 at 1:34 pm at Prisma Health Richland Hospital.

She was born March 10, 1952 in Newberry County, South Carolina. Reverend Gallman was the fourth child and first daughter of the late Sam and Mildred (Wise) Davenport. Reverend Gallman attended the public schools of Newberry County, after which she moved to Columbia and graduated from Columbia High School. She furthered her studies at Waverly School of Cosmetology in Columbia, S.C. and received her cosmetologist license in 1979. Reverend Gallman was the owner of Nu-Image Beauty Salon where she remained a licensed, practicing cosmetologist for 33 years. She was also a Certified Inter-State Barber Cosmetology Examiner.

At an early age, Reverend Gallman accepted Christ, baptized and was a faithful member of Mt. Olive AME Church. Lever Chapel AME Church and Shiloh AME Church, throughout her life and maintained her faith in the Lord until she was called home. She had a very strong faith and believed in the power of prayer and would stop at any given time to have a word of prayer with whoever needed it. She realized her higher calling to serve her Lord and Savior Jesus Christ on March 17, 2007; Reverend Gallman conducted her initial sermon on September 30, 2007 and was licensed to preach as an Evangelist, at the second quarterly conference by Elder Joseph Postell in Newberry-Spartanburg District, on December 9, 2007.

Reverend Gallman attended Erskine Theological Seminary and became certified in Local Church Ministry in May of 2011. She was a proud 2015 honor graduate of Piedmont Technical College, where she earned an Associate Degree in Human Service. Reverend Gallman was a woman of strong faith who was deeply devoted to her family, excelled in entrepreneurship and was committed to enriching her community and serving her parishioners and the AME Church.

She was an ordained Minister in African Methodist Episcopal Church and as local Deacon by the Rt. Reverend Dr. Preston Warren Williams II on May 14, 2011, at Mt. Moriah A.M.E. Church, in Prosperity, S.C. Upon completing additional requirements. Reverend Gallman was later ordained as a local Elder in 2015. She served as a faithful. devoted Pastor of Mt. Zion AME Church in Jalapa, S.C. for 9 years. Reverend Gallman served as the African Methodist Episcopal Women in Ministry Coordinator for the Newberry District.
