From Rev. Kevin McCoy Hunt, Senior Pastor of Trinity United Bible Church of Coatesville:

To the Stokes' sisters, Margarita, Kay, Deborah, Angela, and especially Rosa, my 79' Classmate throughout my Coatesville Public School Experience, your spouses and family at large:

I was glad to attend last night's watch and viewing our dear brother, for the last time, on this side of glory, beyond photos. You have my deepest sympathies.

Deacon Richard Stokes, along with his lovely wife, Mrs. Josephine, made a profound impact on my life that I will always cherish, once my father, J. Emmett Hunt moved back into Coatesville, as the proprietor of the former Sarah. B. Prout Funeral Home, at 725 Merchant Street, Coatesville, PA. Besides their interactive relationship through the Baptist Church affairs and Masonry, Mrs. Stokes was my 3rd grade teacher, and at that time, my first black teacher, performed it with such grace and distinguished values. She is written in the first chapter of my book, "44 Degrees", and I could have shared a whole lot more. How blessed I was and how she made us feel, as her young students.

Here is a funny story but it describes some of the gracious impact that I am referring to. It was there at the Terry Elementary School that I had 'a puppy love' for the young lady, also in another class but nonetheless, 3rd grade, Rosa by name. You know, dogs only remain puppies for a year or less, so cut that in half.....and that was my plight with Ms. Rosa Stokes. But, young church acquaintance, who now is my brother-in-law, Jeffrey Hyden, was in the same grade and but his family moved out of Coatesville, to Atglen and the Octorara School District. So, we were now in the fourth grade, and Jeffery comes around my house on a Sunday afternoon. He suddenly gets the impulse, and wants to go visit...Who? Rosa Stokes. So I give in as I know that she no longer adored me....but Jeffrey was still trying, now that I failed. So we walk from Merchant Street to the house on 9th Avenue and Chestnut Street, and knock on the door. Debbie answers, and we ask for Rosa. Rosa comes to the door, and states: "Wait a minute". So Jeffrey and I are waiting and prancing back and forth, outside the gated fence. Who

comes suddenly to the door? Deacon Richard Stokes. He said: "So, you want to see my daughter Rosa, huh? And we are shaking- like standing before the Wizard of Oz- and He says "Alright". We had this big old relief on our faces, when all of a sudden, Mr. Stokes continues his statement: "You can come in, if you wash all the dishes!" We said, "Wash the dishes?" He said, "Yes, you will have to wash the dishes, and then after we eat dinner, wash them again, and put them away." Then he said, "Or you can visit another time." Guess what? That ended all player, I mean befriending-Sunday visitations.

And I am now happily married with 5 children, and 5 grandchildren, and have been WASHING dishes ever since. Deacon Stokes said a whole lot that day and I can remember it like it was YESTERDAY.
