

After being the baby for two years, his sister Carmen "Teresa" was born and five years later baby girl Ernestine "LaVerne" was born. He also had a very special love for his two brothers Kelvin "Rick" Brown and Barry Wright.

An Uncle

Paul loved his nieces and nephews and each one held a special place in his heart. They all had great respect for him, but they also had that fear when the tone of his voice was different when he called their names. They knew if you got caught acting up, you were in deep trouble with him.

A Husband and Father

On July 24, 1999, Paul married Andretta Williams and to this union one daughter was born, his love, Makaila Alexis Chatman. He also had a step-daughter, Kenyatta Roach whom he loved as his own.

A Friend

At an early age he was diagnosed with Diabetes and as the years passed he battled several other illnesses. Regardless of what tried to get him down, and the bad news he would receive from Doctors, he NEVER COMPLAINED. Through many, many hospital stays he was a fighter and would bounce back. He had a "Fight for Life" that was so strong. In 2015, after being told by several Doctors that they had done everything for him that they could do, he told them "I'll be alright, I SERVE A MIGHTY GOD."
