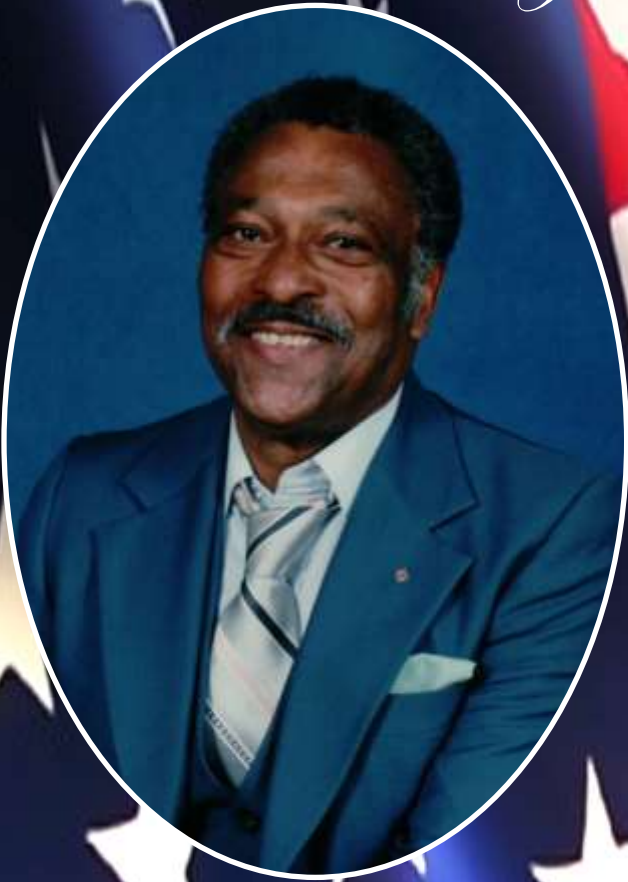

## Obituary

Deacon Moore and his wife, the late Deaconess Mattie Able Moore served as devout Christians who loved GOD! He attended St. Paul Missionary Baptist Church for over 60 years. During this period of time, he served as trustee, choir leader, helped maintain the appearance of the church and worked alongside dedicated men from the church to brick in the sanctuary.

He received his high school education from Fairfield County Training School, Camp Liberty and studied electrical engineering at Friendship College. During World War II, Deacon Moore served as an Army Air Corps Technician with Company B 1909<sup>th</sup> Engineer Aviation Battalion. This was the same company as the famous Tuskegee Airmen, "Red Tails." After receiving an Honorable Discharge on May 15, 1946, he returned to Winnsboro and worked as a farmer. Eventually, he pursued and gained employment with the Fairfield Highway Department, the Fairfield Rock Quarry in Rion and Fairfield Electric Coops. He was the first Black linesman to be employed with the Rural Electric Cooperatives of Fairfield County and retired from the company with 30 years of service.

As a member of the Prince Hall Masonic Temple, he served diligently until failing health prevented him from continuing in the capacity for which he was accustomed. Mr. Moore, affectionately and respectfully called by many, was considered a "Jack of all Trades". There was nothing impossible for him to accomplish. Daddy, granddaddy, great-granddaddy, great-great-granddaddy, and Uncle Louie or "my favorite uncle", as he was lovingly called, served as a godly role model for his children, future generations, nieces, nephews and other admiring youth from the neighborhood and church.

Deacon Louie Hicklon Moore is survived by eight children: Julius Cornelius Moore, Elder Jennifer Moore Harper Jenkins (Edward) and Mary Ann Moore Anderson (James L.) of Winnsboro, SC, Margaret Louise Moore Mack (James) and Carolyn Moore Belton (David) of Columbia, SC, James Jacob Moore (Marvy) of Duluth, GA, Louie Stephone Moore (Carolyn) of Winnsboro, SC, Terence DeWayne Moore (Kristina) of Millville, NJ; his nephew, Brice "Bruce" Whitaker (Gwen) of Detroit, MI; and a host of nieces, nephews, cousins, other relatives and friends.

Deacon Moore was the proud grandfather of thirty-three grandchildren, thirty great-grandchildren, and one great-great-grandchild.

He was preceded in death by twelve brothers and sisters: James Moore, Paul Moore, Louise Moore Lumpkins, Ivory Moore Whitaker, Erlene Moore Burrell, Olla Moore Somerville, George Moore, Willie Moore, David Moore, Sadie Moore Belton, Henrietta Moore, and Clara Moore.
