Gloria worked various jobs throughout the community but most will remember her kindred spirit at Walmart on Killian Road in Columbia, SC.

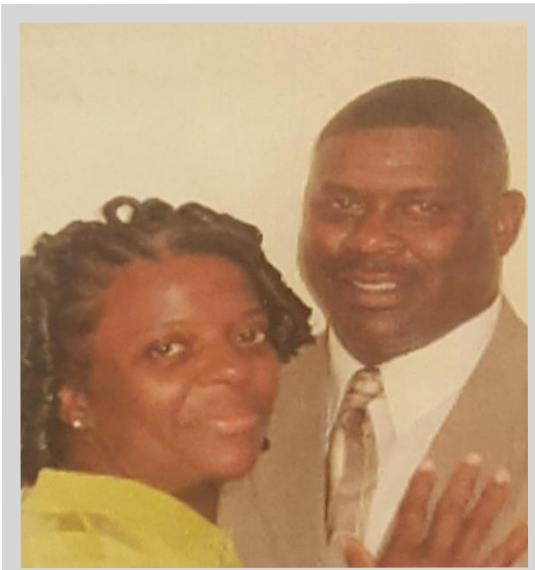
