Obituary

Ms. Marguerite Johnson Davis was born on June 2, 1947 in Washington, DC to the late Wesley and Katie Able and she departed this life on Friday, December 18, 2020 at Prisma Health Richland Hospital in Columbia, SC.

Marguerite was educated in the Washington, DC Public Schools and graduated from Cardozo High School in 1966. She worked at the Internal Revenue Service in Administrative Training while she was in high school. During the Vietnam Era, she served as a Civilian Personnel Administrative Assistant for the Department of the Army at the Pentagon and Fort McNair. There she witnessed gun salutes honoring the death of former President Lyndon B. Johnson and she also witnessed President Nixon boarding Marine One at Fort McNair after his formal resignation.

For promotional advancement, she served under the Support Services Division as Office Service Manager, training and teaching other staff. The remainder of her tenure in government services was under the former District of Columbia mayor, Marion Berry where she received an Outstanding Job Performance rating in 1987. She also served as the Director of Human Services and she served on the District of Columbia Fund Drive Committee and Retirement Committee. Due to her health, she retired from the federal government in 1987 and moved to South Carolina in 1990.

After moving to South Carolina, she worked at a funeral home and served as a missionary at her church, Refuge Temple. While working for Refuge Temple, she served as an Administrative Assistant, Church Cashier, and Bookstore Cashier. Marguerite also prepared the pastor's monthly CPA reports, worked on the prison ministry and helped supervise the Youth Summer Enrichment Program and Feeding Program.

Marguerite is survived by her four children, Dr. Carmen Johnson, William (Tracy) Johnson, Sonja Johnson (Jeremiah) Robertson, Karen Johnson (Anthony) Smith and their father, Roger Johnson; grandchildren, Shameka, Jason, Isaiah, Xaviera, Marquis, Whittney, Keana, Rainin, Jalen, Alycia, Anthony, Jr., Khaila, Joshua, Delila and Benjamin; great-grandchildren, Jaslyn, Paisley, Haleigh, Chance, Jaziah, Xyla, and Presley; one sister-in-law, Kathy Johnson; best friend/cousin, Joan Mathis and a host of other relatives and friends who loved her.
