God has been merciful all the days of my life and to its end.

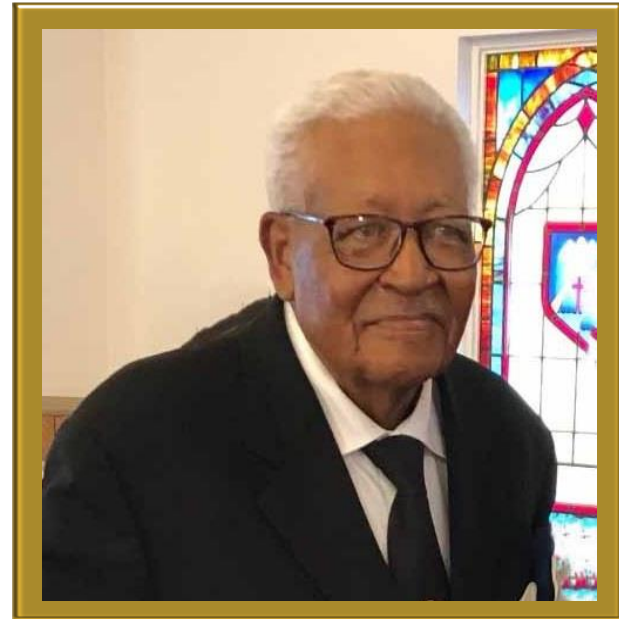
If you weep, do so out of joy and not sorrow because I fulfilled the Master's Plan for my life and I want you to do the same.

Mr. George Washington Robertson, Jr., affectionately called “Son” by his parents and siblings was born September 13, 1923 in Ridgeway, SC to the late Reverend George W. Robertson, Sr. and Mattie Gibson Robertson. He gave up this earthly life for eternal life on Friday, February 26, 2021 after a brief illness.

George was a man of integrity and his word was his bond. His strength was through his faith. He loved his family and people in general. His smile was infectious. You couldn’t help but love him. He had a spirit of kindness and genuine concern for others. He loved to hunt, fish, having his own garden and selling those good sweet potatoes. He also loved baseball and was an avid Atlanta Braves fan and traveled on many occasions to see them play in Atlanta, Georgia.

At an early age, George accepted Christ and was a lifelong member of Macedonia Baptist Church where he served faithfully on the Jubilee choir, a supporter of the Macedonia Brotherhood, the oldest member of the church, and best dressed male in the church “hands down.”

He retired from Bowater Corporation in 1985 and prior to that he worked for Richtex Brick and he also was a logger during his lifetime. His last employer before and after retiring was the late Attorney Edmund Monteith who he worked for many years. George also maintained his driver’s license and was still driving at the age of 97.
